

Mid-America Paleontology Society Board Meeting April 2, 2016. Expo, Sharpless Auction, Iowa City, Iowa

Board Members present: Marv Houg, Gil Norris, Dale Stout, Jim Preslicka, John Catalani, Chris Cozart, Tom Williams, Tiffany Adrain (scribe), Doug DeRosear.

Mary called the meeting to order at 3.48pm.

Minutes from the February 2016 meeting were circulated (also by email previously). Jim motioned to approve the minutes, Tom seconded. Minutes were approved.

Jim read the Treasurer's Report. Marv has sponsorship checks.

Marv had 1,500 tri-folds printed instead of 1,000. Gil proposed that MAPS pay the extra cost. Tom seconded. Motion approved.

John recommended that the number of printed Digests be reduced. Tom moved that Digests not be mailed to members who had not paid their dues. Chris seconded. Motion approved.

Marv has had a request for an ad to be placed in the monthly newsletter by an auction house selling fossil-related materials. Will this set a precedent and how much should the charge be? John said that ad space should be sold as quarter-, half-, or full-page rather than by column-inches and should make money rather than break even. John proposed the motion to include quarter-, half-, or full-page fossil-related ads on request in the non-Expo Digest and newsletters. John, Jim and Marv will work out costs and send to board for vote. Tom seconded the motion. Motion approved.

John recommended a two- to three-year wait period before each Expo Digest is made available online on the MAPS website.

Tom would like a six-table maximum limit for Expo vendors.

The 2017 Expo theme is the Silurian. Several members have offered to submit papers already.

Mary moved to adjourn the meeting, Jim seconded. Meeting adjourned at 4.12pm.

Mid-America Paleontology Society Board Meeting November 12, 2016. Trowbridge Hall, Iowa City

Board Members present: Marv Houg, Dale Stout, Jim Preslicka, Karl Stuekerjuergen, Doug DeRosear, Tiffany Adrain (scribe).

Dr. Julie Meachen, Assistant Professor at Des Moines University, presented a program entitled "Natural Trap Cave; a record from the last glacial maximum to the Holocene. Mary called the meeting to order at 2.30pm.

Minutes from the April 2016 meeting were circulated. Karl moved to approve the minutes, Dale seconded. Minutes were approved.

Jim read the Treasurer's Report, which had been emailed to board members prior to the meeting. Awaiting Allegra invoice. Will distribute scholarships (usually totaling \$2,000) in January. Marv stated that he still had to get some money from Dan Cooper. Jim said \$9,000 is typically required for an Expo cycle. Membership renewals are starting to come in. Sharpless deposit will be paid before Christmas. Marv said Membership Directories will no longer be printed. Marv motioned to pay scholarship now at same rate as last year. Dale motioned to approve, Doug seconded. Motion carried.

Show Report:

- Marv said John sent a newsletter draft to the Board, and suggested changes to the ad regarding dues, and regarding sales tax (see below).
- Articles are invited for the Digest
- Expo speakers: Gerry Kloc, Kent Smith, Richard Strapel Dale will contact them regarding titles and abstracts.
- Tiffany will contact Iowa City Science Booster Club about an evolution workshop presentation, and Paul Liu about a Winneshiek Fauna presentation.
- Table rental is secured.
- Floor plan: same arrangement as last year's good circulation.
- Advertising: Ray used Facebook last year. Marv will ask him to do it again this year. Put ads in Pennysaver, Hoopla? Marv will talk to Dan re local papers.
- Dale and Tiffany to send Marv a list of where to send flyers/advertise. Social media is important use Twitter and Facebook! Can put up flyers in Hy-Vee etc. the week before. Flyers will be printed soon (c. 1,000) and a pdf version will be sent out.
- Displays: Ray Garton offered to bring a Dimetrodon model.
- Dale is working on a news release.

- Show security: Bill Desmarais is organizing this.

John Catalani, MAPS member, presented a program entitled "An Ordovician Konzentrat-Lagerstätte: The Dixon Mifflin Residuum Fauna."

Mary called the meeting to order at 2.20pm.

Minutes from the November 2016 meeting were circulated. John moved to approve the minutes, Bob seconded. Minutes were approved.

Jim read the Treasurer's Report. There was a request from PRI to increase the scholarship donation from

\$500 to \$600 to cover the cost of sending a representative to Expo. There was discussion about the intended purpose of the donation. Tiffany offered to contact the PRI rep and invite them to stay at her house. Tiffany will let Tom know of any response. Dale motioned to approve the Treasurer's report, Bob seconded, report approved.

Tom gave a report on the Expo show:

- 110 tables are reserved already, another 10-15 anticipated, at least.
- Everyone must remember that it takes 30 days to get a tax ID, easy to apply for on-line.
- All members MUST get their membership materials. Some members are letting membership lapse because they are not receiving anything.
- 2018 show dates: April 6-8 (weekend after Easter).
- Bright colors are best for Expo cards yellow next year. The size is good for picking up.
- John is having to do a lot of work to reformat manuscripts. Suggest a style guide for contributors.
- Tiffany agreed to submit an article on specimen curation and labeling.
- Dale emailed speakers for workshops (Gerry, Kent and Richard). Tiffany emailed Paul Liu and spoke with the Iowa City Science Booster Club.
- Ask Don Johnson about EIPP display.
- Last year we rented 55 additional tables.
- Tom is working on floor layout, similar to last year's layout, which worked well for silent auction.
- Advertising local papers. Look for and share Facebook page (National Fossil Exposition XXXIX)
- Dan (motel show) and MAPS share cost of local news ads for the previous weekend and free Wednesday papers.
- Displays: Tom is corresponding with Greg Olsen. Other displays by Don Johnson and Ray Garton.
- Mary will send around the 2017 show flyer. Will get 200 printed for distribution.
- News release Tiffany will send Scorpy photo to Dale.
- Awards: please send nominations to Marv.
- Show security is organized.
- Carl Brett is confirmed as the Keynote Speaker. John will ask him about hotel accommodation, travel etc. He should associate himself with MAPS when he books accommodation, for the correct rate.
- Jim will check how many cards were printed this year so the same can be printed for next year.
- Dan said there are major buyers coming in. He sent an email to dealers.
- Tom will pre-list auction items. Jim confirmed that Amy Preslicka will run the Silent Auction.

Tiffany is working with the UI Library to get the Digest Archive on-line.

Jim will put a note about MAPS member badges on the website (\$7 each? Dale will confirm).

New Business: Bob asked about MAPS' charitable status – are donations tax deductible. Dale will check. This would be helpful for donating funds for speakers, etc. Bob might be able to help with contact with an attorney.

Mary moved to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 3.12pm.

Minutes from the January 2017 meeting were circulated. Karl moved to approve the minutes with minor corrections, Gil seconded. Minutes were approved.


Jim read the Treasurer's report. Mary said the Clarion room rental will be \$150. Gil motioned to approve the report. Doug seconded and the report was approved.
